



ASA/UKCC Level 2 Certificate for Teaching Aquatics

Course Information Sheet

Description

This qualification is aimed at those interested in the teaching programme in a learn to swim environment utilising the ASA National Plan for Teaching Swimming (NPTS). It is recognised as an UKCC Level 2 qualification and is on the QCF at Level 2.

Role

Once qualified the holder of the ASA/UKCC Level 2 Certificate for Teaching Aquatics will be equipped to plan, deliver and evaluate a series of consecutive sessions within the context of a self-prepared scheme of work.

Syllabus

This certificate consists of 8 units. Units 201-204 are common to all aquatic disciplines focussing on core coaching/teaching skills and knowledge. Units 205-208 are specific to teaching aquatics focussing on technical knowledge and practical skills.

- **Unit 201** – Understanding the FUNdamentals of teaching/coaching sport
- **Unit 202** – Understanding how to develop participants through teaching/coaching
- **Unit 203** – Supporting participants lifestyle through coaching/teaching sport
- **Unit 204** – Understanding the principles of safe and equitable coaching/teaching practice
- **Unit 205** – Plan a series of teaching aquatic sessions
- **Unit 206** – Preparing the teaching aquatic environment
- **Unit 207** – Deliver a series of teaching aquatic sessions
- **Unit 208** – Monitor and evaluate teaching aquatic sessions

Units can either be taken separately or at the same course. Units 201-204 must be completed prior to progressing to units 205-208.

Pre-requisites

- Candidates must be at least 17 years of age at the start of the course.
- Hold either:
 - ASA/UKCC Level 1 Certificate for Teaching Aquatics
 - ASA Level 1 Certificate for Teaching Swimming
 - ASA Assistant Teachers Certificate

Recognition of Prior Learning

All of The ASA/UKCC qualifications allow candidates to present evidence of learning either formal or informal that has taken place prior to the course for consideration against the course learning outcomes. Candidates will be asked to complete a questionnaire prior to the course to help identify any areas of prior learning and help the tutor to tailor the course to individual candidates.



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Assessment

- All units are assessed by the tutor/assessor
- Assessment methods are determined by tutor/assessor in conjunction with the candidate
- Completion of an assessment portfolio to meet the Learning Outcomes of the qualification
